

Evaluation of the achievement of quality objectives set for the period until 31 August 2020

1. Improvement of the recognition of the international studies of the students of FBE by the improvement of the Faculty recognition system

In relation to the Erasmus+ regulation approved in December 2018, the management of the Faculty of Business and Economics implemented the inauguration of a self-developed online planning system, as a result of which a better planning of the abroad studies of the outbound students and a more effective recognition of them in the obligatory and specialised modules were expected. It was an objective to have in the 2019/2020 school year an increased proportion of recognition of subjects completed abroad by the students.

Measurement of the objective takes place by the proportion of credits recognised within the total of credits recognised in modules A and B of the curriculum.

Base value (2018/2019): 58.6%

Target value (2019/2020): 56.3%

(Acknowledged in modules A and B: 231, acknowledged in module C: 179, acknowledged total: 410)

The actual value is 2.3% below the base value.

The reasons for this are as follows:

- outbound travels in the Spring semester were blocked by the COVID-19 pandemic
- all of the credits not recognised in modules A and B were recognised in module C, so the denominator of the fraction used for the measurement increased

Despite the underperformance of the actual values, the management has made the necessary steps for meeting the quality objective. The online planning system has been introduced and is in operation since then.

The quality goal has not been met.

2. Acquisition of an international accreditation for the English language Business Administration and Management BSc programme

The Faculty of Business and Economics is dedicated to the increase of the standards and the improvement of quality. High quality education is well symbolised by the EPAS accreditation that may also make a contribution to the internationalisation efforts of the Faculty. The objective set is the acquisition of the EPAS accreditation for the BSc Business Administration and Management programme.

Based on the visit of the EPAS visiting committee on 16-18 October 2019 and the report made on the findings of this visit, the EPAS Accreditation Committee awarded on 3 March 2020 the EPAS accreditation to the English language Business Administration and Management BSc programme of the FBE of UP, for a period of three years.

The quality goal has been met.

3. Launch of infrastructure developments at the Faculty

From the resources remaining from the resources formerly allocated by the Modern Cities Programme to the Faculty but not used for the original purpose (University Business Center) the management of the Faculty has prepared several infrastructure developments. The most significant of these is the reconstruction of the air conditioning system in the total of the building, the importance of which is increased especially by the international accreditation. The quality objective is the actual launch of the reconstruction of the air conditioning system as a Faculty infrastructure development project.

The reconstruction of the air conditioning system means the development of the total of the air conditioning and ventilation system in building B at Rákóczi street. During the project all teaching rooms and offices will be equipped with new air conditioning devices; also, the appliances responsible for ventilation in teaching rooms will be renewed. The project was started in February 2020 and is expected to finish on 31 October 2020.

The quality goal has been met.
